2024 BC Winter Games

22 - 25 Feb 2024 Quesnel, BC

The selection procedures for BCWG are a Zone responsibility carried out in accordance to the BCWG Technical Regulations. Please see here.

2024 Artistic Gymnastics BC Championships

28-30 Mar 2024 Vancouver, BC

Qualification standards are in place for L6 athletes only. L6 athletes must score a minimum of 32.00 AA at least once, at a GymBC sanctioned event or at an out of province competition with verifiable online results, prior to March 11 or prior to registering for the 2023 Artistic BC Championships, whichever comes first. L6 athletes unable to attain the qualification score with extenuating circumstances may petition to the WTC for participation by emailing wag@gymbc.org with any supporting information available.

There are no qualification scores for any other WAG category at this event. High Performance athletes do not have to qualify for Artistic Gymnastics BC Championships, but they must attend as an athlete, coach, judge, demonstrator or volunteer. There will be no Aspire Youth at this event.

2024 Compulsory BC Championships

11-12 Apr 2024 North Vancouver, BC

Qualification standards are in effect for all athletes (L1 to 5) who must score a minimum of 32.00 AA at least once, at a GymBC sanctioned event or at an out of province competition with verifiable online results, prior to March 25 or prior to registration for the 2024 Compulsory BC Championships, whichever comes first.

2024 GymBC Xcel Challenge

13-14 Apr 2024 North Vancouver, BC

Qualification standards are in effect for all athletes (Bronze, Silver, Gold, Platinum, Diamond) who must score a minimum of 32.00 AA at least once, at a GymBC sanctioned event or at an out of province competition with verifiable online results, prior to March 25 or prior to registration for the 2024 GymBC Xcel Challenge, whichever comes first.

2024 Western Canadian Championships

18 - 20 Apr 2024 Langley, BC

The 2024 Inspire Cup will be the only trial event for Westerns. Selection to the Westerns team for each category will be based 100% on rankings from this event only. **Petitions will not be accepted.**

Categories included at the 2024 Westerns are CCP L8-9-10.

For All Levels

- Top 7 All-Around ranked athletes in their respective age groups make up the team.
- In the event of a tie for Team BC selection, the highest scoring athlete using their top 3 apparatus scores at trials will prevail. If the tie still remains, the highest scoring athlete using their top 2 apparatus scores at trials will prevail. If the tie still remains, the athlete with the highest scoring single apparatus score will prevail. In the below example, Athlete Y is named to the team.

- The ranked order of each athlete will be used to determine the team coaches.
- If any Western province does not send a full team, wildcard spots may become available. Availability
 of wildcards in only known after provinces register for Westerns with the host. There is a maximum
 of 2 wild cards per level per province. BC may or may not accept available wildcard positions. In
 2024, BC has received and accepted 8 wildcard spots (2 for each age group in L9 and L10).
- One non-travelling alternate will be named for each team following the same selection principles as above.

Competition Format, Awards, Athlete Funding, Coach Funding

Preparation Camp

The Westerns preparation camp will be held on Wednesday April 17th at Langley Gymnastics Foundation. The training camp is mandatory for team athletes, coaches, judges and support staff, unless otherwise arranged.

2024 Canadian Championships

5-9 Jun, 2024

Gatineau, QC

Qualification to Canadian Championships will be a two-step process. Athletes will be looking to qualify to the final trial using their best All-Around score out of Inspire Cup (WCC trials) or BC Championships. A maximum of 10 athletes per age/level will be registered for the final trial on the Friday of the Delta Cash & Carry competition. In the case of a tie in 10th place to qualify to the final trial, all tied athletes will be invited to the final trial. The final teams will be decided based on combined All-Around scores weighed equally: best AA score from Inspire Cup and/or BC Championships (50%) and final trial at Cash & Carry (50%). Petitions will not be accepted.

Categories included at the 2024 Canadians are **HP Novice-Junior-Senior and CCP L9-10.** HP athletes attend Canadian Championships based on their GymCan awarded status and do not need to participate in any trials. However, they are expected to attend the preparation camp.

For CCP Levels 9-10

- Top 6 All-Around ranked athletes in their respective age groups make up the team.
- In the event of a tie for Team BC selection, the highest scoring athlete using their top 3 apparatus scores from their best AA at Inspire Cup or BC Championships and from the final trial will prevail. If the tie still remains, the highest scoring athlete using their top 2 apparatus scores each day at trials will prevail. If the tie still remains, the athlete with the highest scoring single apparatus score will prevail. In the below example, Athlete Y is named to the team.
