#### MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR

## Ana Arciniega | Chair



As I complete my first year as Chair of Gymnastics BC (GBC), I reflect on the many developments that have occurred over the last year. There have been so many challenges for all of us, as well as on a personal level for me; however, we have pulled through and continue to work with dedication and focus.

It is a BIG deal to be celebrating 50 years as a society! As the world continues to change, what sets a successful organization apart from the rest—and what makes an organization stand the test of time—is the ability to overcome challenges and adapt to change.

Earlier in the year, GBC's CEO of 7 years, Brian Forrester, departed the organization and our Board undertook a search for a replacement. GBC's previous Technical Director, Andrée Montreuil, was selected as his successor. With her vast experience in the sport, her years as Technical Director, and the respect she has earned from the sport community, Andrée has become an invaluable leader and we are confident she will be successful in her new role as CEO.

Over the past year, Gymnastics BC has faced significant changes in the trampoline insurance landscape, and the effects have been felt at board, staff, club, and participant levels. On a macrolevel, the insurance changes have highlighted a common priority among all member clubs: an increased need for risk management tools and resources.

GBC staff continue to prioritize educating the sector, connecting with other provinces, and providing valuable resources to support member clubs and ensure all regulations are being followed. In order to increase the risk management resources we provide, GBC is hiring a Risk Management Officer. This position will help member clubs comply with rules, re-develop the Safety First Manual, and create valuable resources to enhance risk management practices across the province.

In fall 2019, in my role as Executive Director at Delta Gymnastics Society, I started a Gym Peers Round Table which convenes once a month. These sessions provide an excellent opportunity to dive into topics of common concern, hone leadership skills, share, discuss and navigate challenges being faced at a club level. Over time, the group has grown in size, and we now have around 20 member clubs participating in our monthly round table sessions! I would like to encourage all gym administrators to join in these conversations; we all share similar issues and concerns, and when we work together, we're able to support each other in a confidential, safe, and productive way.

I am incredibly thankful to the members of GBC's Board of Directors for volunteering their time and talent to direct Gymnastics BC's policies and procedures. The Board is currently tasked with developing a strategic plan, which will set the stage for GBC's goals and priorities in the coming years. Since establishing the Gym Peers group, and having been the Executive Director at Delta Gymnastics for the past seven years, I have had the opportunity to listen and gather information on member club needs. This information will arm GBC with the tools to enhance the valuable support and services provided to member clubs every day.

Gymnastics, as the foundation of all sport and movement, has a critical role to play in physical literacy development across our province. Our coaches are movement educators, and we recognize their value and the contribution they make towards building an active and healthy society. In response to the insurance landscape changes, Gymnastics BC embarked on an initiative to support those affected, by publishing weekly newsletters, titled *Plan*, *Enact*, *Adapt*, where we released tools and resources to help member clubs comply with the trampoline insurance regulations.

GBC's Technical Committees have also provided great support for our athletes and coaches. Shallon Olsen, from Omega Gymnastics, won a silver medal at the 2018 World Championships in Doha. Samantha Smith from Shasta won the gold medal at the 2019 Pan American Games. I must also note Emilie Hong's perfect 10.0 on vault at the 2019 Canada Winter Games. It is quite an accomplishment from these amazing athletes and their coaches.

The Gymnastics for All Committee supported the participation of 487 BC athletes at the Canadian Gymnaestrada hosted at the Richmond Oval. All four Technical Committees hosted their annual planning and education retreats to set common goals and priorities. The WAG program hosted its first BC Compulsory Provincial Championships with the participation of more than 460 athletes. WAG has also developed and piloted a physical ability testing program that will allow in-house, province-wide testing. Together, MAG, WAG and TG earned a total of 164 medals!

I would also like to take this time recognize the contribution of my co-workers, Brittany, Crystal, Debbie, Gurdit, John, Keara, Leanne and Melissa, who are an amazing group of dedicated individuals. I would also like to acknowledge members of the GBC Board of Directors who volunteer their time and energy towards the growth of our sport and organization.

As Gymnastics BC continues on its path to an engagement-centered approach with its members, I know there are still some challenges to come but I am confident that we will achieve success by working together.

### **CANGYM**

In 2019, Team BC athletes in MAG, WAG and TG won 164 medals! That's a lot of bling!


GBC also contributed over \$140,000 to the Canadian Championships and Westerns budget.

# RESPECT IN SPORT COMPLIANCE (RIS)



#### NATIONAL OPEN SUCCESS


For the first time in many years, the BC Men's Program was competitive in the National Open category.



Gymnastics BC partnered with the Flip City Gymnastics Club to host two BC Championships events - the Artistic Optional WAG and MAG, and TG BC Championships in spring 2019. Nearly 1200 athletes, coaches and judges participated in the events.

A new BC Championships event was introduced in 2019 – the WAG JO Compulsory BC Championships. Working alongside the Langley Gymnastics Centre, 450 athletes Levels JO 1-5 had the opportunity to compete in their own BC Championships event.

#### **50TH ANNIVERSARY**

2019 marks Gymnastics BC's 50th anniversary. Over the past fiscal year, GBC worked with the 50th anniversary committee and began organizing events to honor those who've helped develop gymnastics in the province over the last 50 years.

A BC Lions halftime show, history trivia time quizzes, coaching and zone grants, increased scholarship winners and ending the year with a Celebration Gala are only a few of the ways GBC intends to celebrate this and next season.




# **OUR EFFORTS**

# PLAN, ENACT, ADAPT
